E-SAFETY - MOBILE PHONES

A key challenge faced by parents and educators is the use of mobile phones by teens. We want to highlight the critical issue of eSafety and responsible mobile phone usage among our students.

Your child's well-being is our top priority, and we believe it is essential to address the potential dangers associated with mobile phones and the internet.



Phones Can Be Dangerous for Teenagers:

Mobile phones, while undoubtedly useful, can pose risks to teenagers. Excessive screen time, unrestricted access to the internet, and social media can expose them to cyberbullying, inappropriate content, and the addictive lure of digital devices. Additionally, these devices can interfere with sleep patterns, impact academic performance, and hinder face-to-face social interactions.

Our School's Recommendations:

For the safety and well-being of our students, we strongly advise against giving smartphones to children in Years 7 to 9. For those in Year 10 and 11 who already have smartphones, we encourage you to closely monitor their usage. Ensure that your child is aware of responsible internet and phone usage, including privacy settings and the potential risks associated with online activities.

School Policy Reminder:

Our school policy permits students to bring phones into school, but they must remain switched off and out of sight during school hours. Any accessories like headphones or EarPods should also be kept hidden. Any phone or accessory seen by staff will result in immediate confiscation of the phone or accessory, along with a 30-minute detention. The use of a mobile phone during school hours to record or take photos will lead to confiscation until a parent can collect it during a formal meeting with school staff. Students will also then be required to hand in their phone to the school office upon arrival.

Impact of Excessive Screen Time:

Excessive screen time can have negative effects on both the mental and physical health of children. It may lead to poor posture, decreased physical activity, and increased risk of sleep disturbances. We encourage you to limit screen time at home and encourage alternative activities like outdoor play, reading, and spending quality time as a family.
