

CELEBRATING INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY AT SJBC

Last Friday, SJBC proudly celebrated International Women's Day with a range of inspiring activities across the school. Our students engaged in discussions, reflections, and competitions to honour the achievements of women throughout history and in the present day.

The school was decorated in purple, a colour symbolising justice and dignity, both central to the women's rights movement. Throughout the day, lessons explored the contributions of women in various fields, from pioneering scientists to historical leaders who have shaped our world.





A key highlight of the celebrations was our whole-school shout out during break time line up, where students reflected on important but often-overlooked aspects of women's history. Year 8 students shared their insights on:

Hallie Rubenhold's book The Five, which restores dignity to the women murdered by Jack the Ripper, reminding us that they were more than just victims.

The Suffragette movement, recognising the courage of women like Emmeline Pankhurst, who fought for the right to vote and paved the way for gender equality.

The role of clothing in women's history, highlighting how fashion reflects the struggles, societal roles, and resilience of women over time.



We also held an exciting competition celebrating women in science, with congratulations to our Yr 7 winners: Teagan F and William O!

International Women's Day was first established in 1911 by Clara Zetkin, a German activist who championed the recognition of women's achievements and the fight for equality. Over a century later, it remains a powerful reminder of the need for equal opportunities, representation, and respect for women in all aspects of life.

A huge thank you to Ms Sandoval and her dedicated student team, whose efforts ensured this event was both meaningful and memorable for the entire SJBC community.

She has met some very famous and fascinating people in the course of her work including the King, The Dalai Lama and even members of the Taliban!


